2024:

• Paris Summer Olympics

Men's Singles - Silver Medal: Defeated Nr 1 Wang Chuqin in the round of 32 and advanced to the final, where he lost to Fan Zhendong.

Men's Team - Silver Medal: The Swedish men's table tennis team reached the finals and earned the silver medal, with China taking gold.

Legacy and Future Goals


