Póta began practicing table tennis in 1990, which would make her around five years old, aligning with her birth year of 1985. Early in her career, she joined the esteemed Statisztika Table Tennis Club, known for producing many of Hungary's top players. Under expert coaching, she developed an attacking playing style that combined power, precision, and tactical intelligence. Over the years, Póta has been a key figure for Hungary in major international tournaments, helping maintain the nation's strong presence in European table tennis. Her dedication, discipline, and passion for the sport have made her a role model for younger generations.

As of December 2024, Póta remains one of Hungary's most celebrated table tennis players. Her participation in five Olympic Games and her numerous successes on the international stage have solidified her legacy as a Hungarian sports icon.
