

## PLAYING STYLE AND PERSONALITY

Alexis Lebrun is a right-handed, shakehand-grip player known for his technical precision and tactical intelligence. His style blends strong mid-distance counter-attacks with excellent placement and calm shot selection, often prioritizing control over brute force. On court, Alexis is composed, focused, and highly competitive. Frequently praised for his match management and ability to adapt tactically under pressure, he has earned respect as a leader within the French national team. His balanced mix of discipline, resilience, and team spirit continues to make him a standout figure on the international stage.

## BREAKTHROUGH MOMENTS AND ACHIEVEMENTS

2025

### Europe Top-16 Cup (Montreux)

- Won the prestigious Top-16 title in Switzerland, marking a major continental breakthrough and confirming his status as one of Europe's premier players.

### WTT Tour & World Championships

- Delivered sustained high-level performances across WTT events and represented France in both singles and doubles at the ITTF World Championships in Doha, reflecting his transition from continental champion to consistent global contender.

### French National Championships

- Retained the national doubles title and reached the singles final in a dramatic 7-game match against Félix, maintaining his domestic prominence.



2024

### **European Championships (Linz)**

- Captured double gold in singles and doubles, becoming European Champion in both disciplines and underlining his all-round strength.

### **World Team Championships (Busan)**

- Led France to a historic silver medal. His key victories over Jang Woojin and Tomokazu Harimoto were instrumental in the team's best result in nearly 30 years.

### **Paris Summer Olympics**

- Helped France secure a bronze medal in the team event, while gaining valuable experience in the singles competition. His performance enhanced his profile on the global stage.

### **WTT Contender (Zagreb)**

- Claimed the singles title in June 2024, adding a WTT gold to his growing international resume.

2023

### **WTT Champions (Macao)**

- Stunned the table tennis world with a victory over Fan Zhendong. This result marked a major milestone and contributed to his rapid rise in the world rankings.

2022

### **Breakthrough Season**

- Surged from outside the top 1,000 into the top 50 in the world rankings, establishing himself as one of the fastest-rising players on the tour.

2021

### **European Youth Championships**

- Won bronze in singles and silver in the team event. These were his final major junior results before fully transitioning to senior-level play, showcasing both leadership and individual skill.

2019

### **European Youth Championships (Ostrava)**

Won silver in singles and gold in doubles, marking his arrival as one of Europe's top junior players.

2018

### **ITTF French Cadet Open**

- Earned gold in doubles and bronze in singles, signalling his potential on the international junior stage.



2017

### European Cadet Championships

- Captured his first European-level medal with a bronze in cadet singles at age 14 – a foundational moment in his early career.

## CAREER

Alexis Lebrun was born on 27 August 2003 in Montpellier, France, and developed through the French national system, rising quickly through junior and youth levels. Known for his tactical intelligence and modern offensive style, he made a seamless transition to the senior circuit, earning early international recognition for his strategic play and composure under pressure. By 2024–2025, Alexis had firmly established himself as one of France's top singles players and a key figure in team competitions. He became European Champion in both singles and doubles in 2024, contributed to France's silver medal at the World Team Championships, and won the Europe Top-16 title in 2025. Alongside his brother Félix, he continues to be a central force for club and country, combining domestic success with strong international campaigns across the WTT circuit.

## LEGACY AND FUTURE GOALS

By the end of 2025, Alexis Lebrun is widely regarded as one of the leaders of a new generation that has revitalised French table tennis. Alongside his brother Félix, he has helped turn France into a serious contender on the European and world stage, winning continental titles and earning Olympic and World Championship medals. His Top-16 victory and consistent WTT performances have reinforced his status as a standout French singles player of the mid-2020s.

Looking ahead, Alexis aims to translate continental success into major WTT and ITTF titles, push further into Grand Smash and Champions events, and solidify his position among the world's top-ranked players. He remains a central figure in France's ambitions for future team and doubles success at the highest level, including upcoming World Championships and Olympic Games.
