PLAYING STYLE AND PERSONALITY

Andreea Dragoman plays a right-handed shakehand grip with a tactical, attacking style. Her game emphasizes variation in placement and tempo, making her effective in constructing points and exploiting opponent weaknesses, particularly in doubles and team formats. Known as a reliable and team-focused competitor, Dragoman has earned repeated selection for Romania's national team in major events. Her consistent performances in doubles reflect strong coordination, adaptability, and a selfless playing spirit valued in team competitions.

BREAKTHROUGH MOMENTS AND ACHIEVEMENTS

2025

Belgium Open (2025)

- Won the Women's Singles title, a major individual senior international success and a key milestone in her career.

European Championships (Zadar)

- Helped Serbia win the Silver medal in the Women's Team event, marking a top continental achievement.

Romanian National Championships (2025)

- Claimed her first senior national singles title and a national doubles crown, plus a bronze in mixed – a breakthrough in domestic dominance.

World Table Tennis Championships (Doha)

- Reached the Round of 32 in women's singles, including a notable victory over Elizabeta Samara – her best performance to date at a global finals.

2024

European Championships (Linz)

- Bronze medal in Women's Doubles with Sabina Šurjan – a major continental podium for Lupulesku.

2017

Europe Youth Top-10 (Tours)

- Won the Junior Girls' Singles title, representing a key early success on the European junior circuit.

CAREER

Born on 18 August 2000 in Mediaș, Romania, Andreea Dragoman rose to prominence with a bronze medal at the 2018 Youth Olympic Games. She has since developed into a reliable member of the Romanian senior team, consistently selected for European and World competitions.

In 2025, Dragoman captured the Belgium Open Women's Singles title – a major individual milestone – and contributed to Romania's silver-medal run at the European Team Championships. At the national level, she won gold in women's doubles and two bronze medals (singles and mixed) at the Romanian Championships. Her growing presence on the WTT circuit, including quarterfinal runs and regular main draw appearances, reflects steady progress toward the international elite.

LEGACY AND FUTURE GOALS

As of late 2025, Dragoman is increasingly seen as a key contributor to Romania's women's team – both in team events and doubles partnerships – while also gaining ground as a singles contender. With her first international senior title now secured, her next goals likely include further climbing the ITTF world rankings, deeper runs in WTT Contender and Star Contender events, and qualification for upcoming World Championships and Olympic Games.
