Daniel Habesohn is one of Austria's most experienced table tennis professionals. Born in Vienna in 1986, he has represented Austria at multiple major events, including the Olympic Games in Rio 2016 and Tokyo 2020. His career-high world ranking of No. 27, achieved in August 2019, reflects his consistency and international competitiveness. On the club scene, Habesohn has built a long-standing career in the German Bundesliga, spending over a decade with Post SV Mühlhausen before transferring to TSV Bad Königshofen for the 2025/26 season. Known for his tactical awareness, calm demeanor, and match experience, he remains a respected figure in both national and club settings.

LEGACY AND FUTURE GOALS

As of December 2025, Daniel Habesohn is recognized as a veteran leader in Austrian table tennis. His legacy includes multiple European medals, Olympic appearances, and consistent Bundesliga performances.

Looking ahead, he aims to contribute to TSV Bad Königshofen's Bundesliga ambitions and continue to compete selectively on the international stage, focusing on maintaining a high level while managing career longevity.
