PLAYING STYLE AND PERSONALITY

Rachel Moret is a left-handed, shakehand player known for her tactical offensive game, blending controlled aggression with strong placement and defensive variation. Her ability to outmaneuver opponents in tight rallies and deliver key match points has been highlighted in European Top16 play and national championship finals. Off the table, she is regarded as a resilient and strategic competitor with a long career representing Switzerland at major multi-sport events and international circuits.

BREAKTHROUGH MOMENTS AND ACHIEVEMENTS

2025

Swiss National Championships (Möhlin)

- Captured the women's singles title with a dominant 4-0 final win, while also securing women's doubles and mixed doubles gold – her 10th national title.

Europe Top 16 Cup (Montreux)

- Recorded a notable Main Draw victory over a top-20 European opponent (Hana Matelova) in the Europe Top 16 Cup qualifiers, marking a breakthrough at a high-level continental event.

ITTF World Championships (Doha)

- Competed in the women's singles Main Draw at the 2025 World Championships, reflecting her ongoing presence at the highest international tier.

Pre-2025 Highlights

- Represented Switzerland at the 2020 Tokyo Olympic Games, her second Olympic appearance.

CAREER

Rachel Moret (born 23 November 1989 in Morges, Switzerland) is one of Swiss table tennis's most accomplished female players, transitioning from tennis to table tennis at age 12 and advancing through junior ranks to the Swiss national team by age 18. She has claimed multiple Swiss national titles across singles, doubles, and mixed events since her first championship in 2009. Moret has competed extensively on the ITTF/WTT international circuit, including Olympics (Tokyo 2020), European Top 16 Cup, World Championships, and numerous WTT feeder and challenger events. Her 2025 season was marked by national dominance and solid international participation, showcasing sustained competitiveness well into her mid-30s.

LEGACY AND FUTURE GOALS

As of December 2025, Rachel Moret stands as one of the most accomplished Swiss table tennis players in history, with ten national singles titles, an Olympic appearance, and a landmark international victory at the 2016 Chile Open. Her consistent presence in major events like the Europe Top 16 Cup, World Championships, and WTT circuit reflects both her longevity and competitiveness at the elite level. Looking ahead, Moret remains committed to extending her international impact, aiming to build on her world ranking and continue representing Switzerland with distinction in high-level global competitions.
